<p>Child Sexual Exploitation <i>This one day workshop is delivered by Sara Swann, MBE. It introduces the 'boyfriend' model and explores practical and legal solutions. The course links closely to the Safeguarding Children: Sexual Abuse course.</i></p>	<p>January 13th 2010 April 27th 2010</p>
<p>Courtcraft <i>This is a one day workshop for workers who may be required to give evidence at court as part of child care proceedings. Participants have the opportunity to practice at court during the day.</i></p>	<p>November 4th 2009</p>

It explores some of the legal background and the good practice guidance published by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office. <p>Integrated Working: Using the CAF <i>This is a revised half-day course that provides an introduction to the use of the Common Assessment Form (CAF) within Stockport. Workers who completed the initial course could attend this to refresh their skills and knowledge. <p>Integrated Working: Lead Practitioner <i>This half-day workshop is a new addition to the CAF training suite. It looks at the role and responsibilities of being a lead practitioner. <p>Impact of domestic abuse <i>This one day workshop explores the effect of domestic abuse on families. <p>Multi-agency Basic Awareness – child protection <i>This half-day course is an introduction to child protection. <p>Safeguarding children in a digital world <i>This one-day workshop explores the risks to children posed by digital technology including cyberbullying and links to the e-safety policy. The course signposts participants to further training that is available. This course links to the Safeguarding children: Sexual abuse course and the Child Sexual Exploitation courses.</i></p>	<p>February 4th 2010 May 13th 2010</p>
<p>Safeguarding children in families where there parental substance misuse <i>This is a new two day course that explores issues around parents' drug and alcohol use and the impact of this upon their parenting of children and young people. It provides an opportunity to explore support services that are available in Stockport. Before attending this course, participants should complete either a Basic Drugs Awareness course (via the DAT) or the 'How to recognise drug use in young people' course (via MOSAIC). This course also links to the Safeguarding children: Neglect course and is also supported by the MOSAIC course 'Understanding the effects of adult substance misuse on the children around them'.</i></p>	<p>Course 1: November 3rd and November 10th 2009 Course 2: July 1st and July 8th 2010 <i>NB: Participants must attend Day 1 in order to attend Day 2.</i></p>
<p>Safeguarding children where parents have mental health concerns <i>This is a three day course. Day One provides an introduction to basic mental health awareness. Day Two provides an opportunity integrated working and child protection.. Day Three provides an opportunity for both adult's and children's workers to explore the issues around working with families and ways to improve service delivery.</i></p>	<p>February 3rd 2010 March 8th 2010 May 26th 2010 <i>NB: Depending upon knowledge and experience participants must complete either Day 1 and/or day 2 to be eligible to attend Day 3</i></p>
<p>Safeguarding children with disabilities <i>This is a one-day workshop. It looks at the social and medical models of disability and the additional vulnerability of disabled children. It provides an opportunity to explore issues and improve outcomes for children within common processes. <p>Safeguarding children: emotional abuse <i>This is a one day workshop that explores the topic of emotional abuse and examines resilience and how it can help when planning interventions with families. It builds on the introduction from the Basic Awareness. Participants should have completed CAF training before attending this course. Participants who are likely to attend child protection conferences should have completed the Working Together workshop (previously the Safeguarding Children Level 2 workshop)</i></p>	<p>January 14th 2010 March 18th 2010</p>
<p>Safeguarding children: Neglect <i>This is a one day workshop that explores the topic of Neglect and introduces the assessment tool – the Graded Care Profile – as part of the neglect protocol for Stockport. It builds on the introduction from the Basic Awareness. Participants should have completed CAF training before attending this course. Participants who are likely to attend child protection conferences should have completed the Working Together workshop (previously the Safeguarding Children Level 2 workshop) This workshop links to the Safeguarding children in families where there is drug use/ alcohol use courses.</i></p>	<p>October 13th 2009 March 10th 2010</p>
<p>Safeguarding children: physical abuse <i>This is a half day workshop that explores the topic of physical abuse and fabricated illness building on the introduction provided by the Basic Awareness course. Participants should have completed CAF training before attending this course. Participants who are likely to attend child protection conferences should have completed the Working Together workshop (previously the Safeguarding Children Level 2 workshop)</i></p>	<p>September 25th 2009 (am) February 25th 2010 (pm)</p>
<p>Safeguarding children: sexual abuse <i>This is a one day workshop that explores the topic of sexual abuse building on the introduction provided by the Basic Awareness course. The course looks at the process of investigation and the links between civil and court proceedings. It also explores how sexual predators operate and the role of the non-abusing parent. Participants should have completed CAF training before attending this course. Participants who are likely to attend child protection conferences should have completed the Working Together workshop (previously the Safeguarding Children Level 2 workshop)</i></p>	<p>October 14th 2009 March 11th 2010</p>

<p>Safeguarding issues working with the older child <i>This is a one day workshop delivered by Sara Swann, MBE. It provides an opportunity for those who work with older children to explore some of the constraints and legal options that are available to this group. <p>Safeguarding children who may have been trafficked <i>This is an on-line training programme – ‘In your hands’ - designed by ECPAT.</i></p>	<p>Please contact Helen Harrison for details.</p>
<p>Working Together workshop (previously entitled ‘Safeguarding Children Workshop (level 2)’) <i>This is a revised and updated one day workshop that looks at the child protection process as described in the Working Together to Safeguard Children guidance (2006), including information sharing. It provides an opportunity to explore the issues and requirements of child protection meetings for workers who are likely to be involved in them. Participants should have completed a Basic Awareness course and CAF training before attending this course. <p>Allegations Management: Investigation Update <i>This is a one day workshop for those workers who are involved in the investigation of allegations. Those **schools** who subscribe to the Schools and Workforce development website can book places on Safeguarding courses using the usual booking method.

The **closing date** for courses is **one month before the calendar date** of the course. Please note that places are not allocated on a first-come, first-served basis but are allocated to ensure a multi-agency balance once the closing date has passed. Please pencil the date of the course in your diary when you send in your application.

Times of courses are as follows:

All full day courses are 9.15am arrival for a prompt 9.30am start.

All half-day morning courses are 9.15am arrival for a prompt 9.30am start.

All half-day afternoon courses are a 12.45pm arrival for a prompt 1pm start.

Certificates will not be issued to participants who do not complete the full course.

Confirmation of place and course details will be sent out by email to participants and their managers where possible. Your manager will be advised if the application is unsuccessful. If you do not receive any information about the course please contact the Training Administrator as above. If you are unable to attend please let the training administrator know as soon as possible so that your place can be re-allocated.

There is no cost to participants for attending multi-agency courses. However, a record is kept of **non-attendance** at LSCB courses and reports are sent to the LSCB.
