

Online learning

This document signposts to a number of free or low-cost online e-learning packages that are designed to support work to safeguard children, young people and vulnerable adults.

You should access these courses in agreement with your line manager/ organisation safeguarding training requirements.

Please be aware that some of the content of these courses may be upsetting or have a resonance for you. In your discussion with your line manager you should be able to identify someone you can speak to if you are affected by the content. This may be support provided by your employer/ organisation. The NSPCC helpline can also be contacted for advice and support on 0808 800 5000.

When you have completed a course you should save/ print off the certificate as proof of completion and follow your organisation's procedure to update your training record.

In this document the course title is hyperlinked so if you click on the link it should take you to the course. However, if this doesn't work then if you put the course title in to an internet search engine then it should take you to the course.

The target audience for the course is indicated in red.

Courses available from Stockport Council's e-learning system

The SSCB/SSAB provide e-learning packages through the SMBC arrangements with Learning Pool. In order to access the courses, users need to create an account.

<p>Basic Child Protection Awareness e-learning <i>For workers who have previously completed classroom based training and need to update/ workers who are unable to attend classroom sessions.</i> There are two options: Safeguarding Children – basic overview <i>This course is aimed at people who need to be aware of the responsibilities for safeguarding children.</i> Safeguarding Children – introduction for the Children's Services workforce <i>This course is for people who work with children and their families or with adults who are parents.</i> <i>It covers signs and types of abuse, what action you should take and how to make a referral when you have concerns. <p>Mental Capacity Act (MCA) and Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLs) This is for anyone who works with young people aged 16 years and over, and their parents and carers. The course is written by KWANGO. There are two options available to access the e-learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Login via the Stockport Council e-learning system as above. You will still need to set up a KWANGO account. There is a knowledge test on completion. The pass rate determines whether you are able to be certificated. <p>Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) <i>GM Safeguarding procedures section 4.19</i></p> <p>Recognising and preventing FGM Developed by Virtual College with the Home Office suitable for all professionals. It aims to raise awareness of the practice and prevalence of FGM.</p>	Free
<p>Forced Marriage & Honour Based Violence <i>GM safeguarding procedures Section 4.20</i></p> <p>Awareness of forced marriage Developed by Virtual College with the Forced marriage Unit and the Home Office. The course is for all professionals. It aims to raise awareness, challenge perceptions and inform professionals of the correct action to take if they suspect someone is at risk.</p>	Free

<p>Mental Health</p> <p>MindEd This is a comprehensive suite of open access e-learning suitable for all professionals provided by e-learning for health (e-lfh). You can access without an account but you should create an account if you want a record of your learning. There are a large number of modules available on a wide range of topics.</p> <p>The SSCB recommend that you complete these modules from the MindEd core content before you attempt other topics. <p>Self harm</p> <p>Talking to your children about emotional resilience and self-harm</p> <p>This course has been developed by e-Academy in partnership with SelfharmUK to give parents a basic awareness of the subject and help them talk about the issue of self-harm with their children.</p>	Free
<p>Toxic Trio</p> <p>Complicated matters: domestic and sexual violence, problematic substance use and mental health.</p> <p>Domestic and sexual violence, problematic substance use and mental ill health are three concerns which can often co-exist in safeguarding families.
